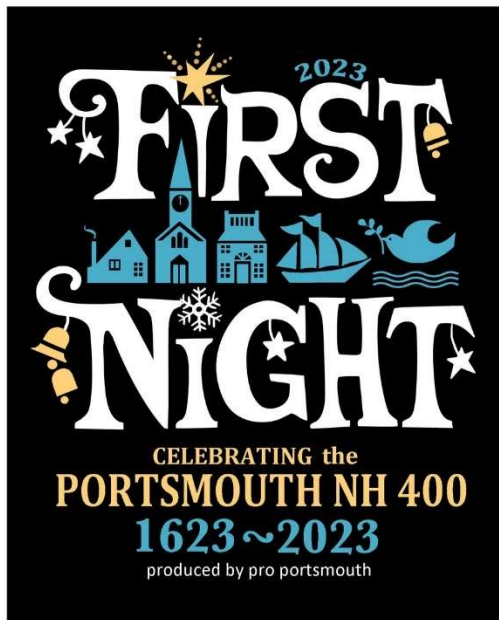

CITY SETS PROPERTY TAX RATE—DETAILS ON TAX BILL PAYMENT –Tax bills ARE DUE JAN 4. Taxpayers can pay their bills anytime from now until January 4, 2023 without accruing interest. 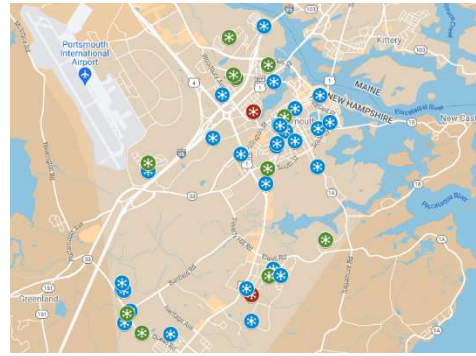

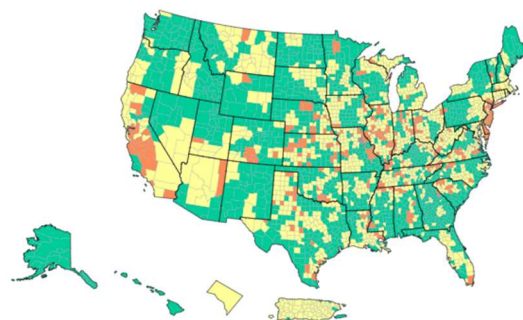

COVID-19 Booster Doses
The best way to protect yourself from COVID-19, including Omicron, is to get vaccinated and boosted.

WHO? Everyone aged 18 and older should get a booster.
When? At least 3 months after your previous dose of booster, shot, or 2 months after a previous booster.

NH DHHS and CDC recommend EVERYONE OVER 5 RECEIVE FULL COVID-19 BOOSTER VACCINE. The CDC has approved the Pfizer-BioNTech (PFC) booster for ages 18 and older and the Moderna (M) booster for ages 18 and older. CROSS ROADS HOUSE WARMING CENTER FOR ROCKINGHAM COUNTY HOMELESS -- Starting immediately the warming center will open from 7 pm to 8 am on any day the forecast temperature or wind chill dips to 28 degrees Fahrenheit or lower, or if heavy snowfall accumulates to six inches. And when there is an inch or more of heavy rainfall, or when ice or sleet accumulates to half an inch or more. People coming to the warming center are given a warm meal and a cot. Before leaving the facility by 8 am, Cross Roads House offers each person the services of a case manager who can assist and direct them to local social services. Rockingham County residents have priority.

OPERATION BLESSING WARMING CENTER, WEEKEND HOT MEALS AND FOOD PANTRY/CLOTHING ROOM -- Operation Blessing, INC at 600a Lafayette Rd opens its 8-bed warming center from 7 pm to 7 am when the temperature is 25 degrees or below. STATE AID CREDIT ON ELECTRIC BILLS --

The NH Legislature has approved allocating \$35 million to NH residents earning from 60% to 75% of the state's median income (\$75,000 to \$93,000 per year for a family of four). Those who are eligible and apply will get \$200 credits on their electric bills and \$450 for heating assistance. Residents with incomes below that threshold already are also eligible for other funds. You must apply through one of these Community Action Program agency to receive the assistance. **Rockingham County**
