Since 1946 the National Multiple Sclerosis Society has been a driving force of MS research, relentlessly pursuing prevention, treatments and a cure, and has invested more than \$1 billion in groundbreaking research, thereby transforming what it means to live with MS and providing global leadership to help achieve the vision of a world free of MS; and

Whereas:

Here in Portsmouth and on the Seacoast we recognize the importance of finding the cause and cure of MS and express our appreciation for the dedication that the National Multiple Sclerosis Society has shown toward creating a world free of MS.
