 - **Portsmouth Public Library**: (5) ash, city request, removal recommended by city. These trees are in poor condition (relating to EAB), and when considering the location it is appropriate to remove before a more hazardous scenario arises.
 - <u>379 Colonial Drive</u>: linden, homeowner request. Homeowner cites several observations as the basis for removal: trees are completely decayed, branches are always falling near powerlines, and roots are coming towards the foundation of their home.
 - <u>224 Elwyn Ave</u>: located on Sherburne Ave. in City ROW behind the house maple, homeowner request, removal recommended by City. This tree has several structural defects present, and a good portion of this tree failed in a recent storm.
 - <u>138 Bartlett St</u>: ash, city request, removal recommended by city. This request is related to the infrastructure improvement that will be occurring on Bartlett St.
 - <u>387 Lang Rd</u>: maple, Eversource request, removal recommended by city. There is a large cavity in the upper crown of the tree.
 - <u>777 Middle Rd</u>: multi-stem cluster near the entrance of Riverbrook as well as one ash near the large oak in the ROW. Eversource request, removal recommended by city. These trees all appear to be in fair/poor condition in a heavily wooded ROW.
 - <u>100 Lafayette Rd</u>: ash, Eversource request, removal recommended by city. The tree is in poor condition (relating to EAB).
 - <u>Coach Rd</u>: (6) birch, city request. These trees will be used for chainsaw felling instruction in a class sponsored through Primex, and will include participants from neighboring municipalities.
